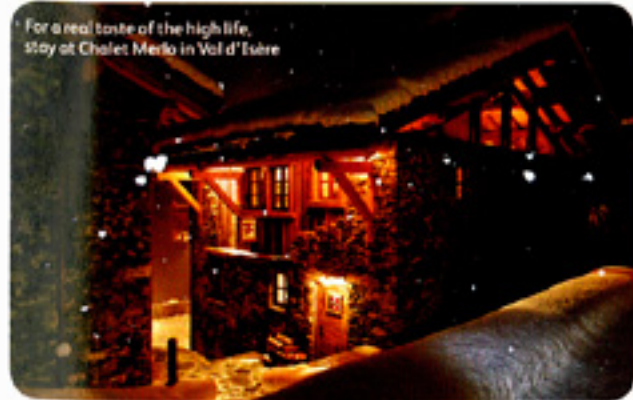
see, this holiday malarkey isn't so bad after all, is it?
